Instead, find a couple of resources that work and build from there. Prioritize your kid's greatest need and then their biggest interest or passion. Look for resources that will keep them connected to their real-life community — piano lessons, Sunday school and local dance classes are all going online. Grandparents and family friends are volunteering to lead activities like story time and craft sessions. You're not going to recreate school in one day, so start small.

- Set up designated space and time for learning. Routine is good, and you can be flexible. It's ok to let everyone sleep in a little later than usual, we are not teaching 7 hours a day, only 2-4 hours.
- Be forgiving of yourself and your kids. This is a stressful time. If home school is causing severe emotional distress, take a break and put on a movie, go noodle, or go outside. Our teachers are also available, make sure to contact them if homeschool is overwhelming you.
- This is a good time for passion projects: It could be cooking, building in Minecraft, or drawing. Find something to enjoy to destress and have fun.
