ZUCCHINI PIZZA BOATS

Ingredients: 6 small zucchini 1 Tablespoon olive oil 1 garlic clove, finely minced Salt and pepper to taste (CRA note: we didn't use any)

1 cup marinara sauce

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups shredded mozzarella cheese

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup finely shredded parmesan cheese

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup mini pepperoni slices

2 Tablespoons fresh oregano chopped (CRA note: If you don't have oregano, try some dry Italian seasoning)

Preparation:

Slice zucchini thinly into boats. (About 1/4") Pat dry with paper towel. Brush with oil and garlic. Top with sauce, cheeses and pepperoni. Bake in a 400 degree oven for 12-18 minutes. (CRA note: Depending on your oven, that might be too long! Check at about 8 minutes...bake long enough to heat and melt the cheese, but you'll want to keep zucchini crisp)
