

Canyon Rim Academy LAND Trust Policy

The Canyon Rim Academy LAND (Learning And Nurturing Development) Trust Council plays an important role in identifying areas for improving student achievement, putting in place a plan to allocate LAND Trust funds to meet those needs, and following up to ensure that those needs are being met.

The LAND Trust Council is made up of elected parents, appointed employees, and the principal. The principal appoints one teacher to the council to serve a two-year term. The principal also serves on the council. Four parent council representatives are elected by parents of children attending Canyon Rim Academy to serve two-year terms. To be eligible to serve on the council, a parent must have a student enrolled in the school for at least one of the years they are on the council. Elections will commence in the month of September, and candidates must submit a declaration of candidacy form to the front office by the appropriate due date.

The roles and responsibilities of the LAND Trust Council are to:

- Meet according to the Open and Public Meetings Act requirements
- Prepare a timeline for the school year that includes due dates for all required reporting
- Post on the website the date and time for council meetings
- Provide an agenda to all council members at least one week in advance of the meeting
- Keep minutes of all meetings and post the minutes on the school's website when approved by the council
- Make decisions with the needs of students as the main objective
