Air Quality Check

One more reminder about the air quality checks at CRA...we check air quality levels daily through the Utah Department of Environmental Quality website. There are two ways they report air quality to the public: 1) by the Particulate Matter levels in the air and 2) by giving the day a color assignment to indicate the level of safety. The following is an index showing the levels that are used to determine air safety. This is taken directly from the Utah Department of Environmental Quality website.

Air Quality Index (AQI)	PM 2.5	Ozone
Good	0 - 12.0 μg/m³	0 - 0.054 ppm
Moderate	12.1 - 35.4 μg/m³	0.055 - 0.070 ppm
Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	35.5 - 55.4 μg/m³	0.071 - 0.085 ppm
Unhealthy	55.5 - 150.4 μg/m³	0.086 - 0.105 ppm
Very Unhealthy	150.5 - 250.4 μg/m³	0.106 - 0.200 ppm
Hazardous	Above 250.5 μg/m³	Above 0.201 ppm
	Based on a 24-hour average.	Based on an 8-hour average.

Be assured that we will keep students in from recess based on this index. Today has been an Orange Day with a Particulate Matter currently at 46.9. (That number typically fluctuates throughout the day.) Students with asthma or breathing issues have stayed in from recess today. All students will be kept in from recess when air quality is in the Red range or above.

We also find that because we are located closer to the mountains, our air quality here may not always be as severe as the other areas of Salt Lake County. We may also use other monitoring systems to get the best and most current information possible.
