A Message from your principal

Your Child May Already Have One....

If you've never heard of a fidget spinner, it appears to be the newest craze for children. Spinners are small handheld toys with a ball bearing in the center and prongs that come out from there. By tapping it with a finger, they spin... they come in many colors, configurations and price ranges from inexpensive to more costly.

These devices are marketed under the banner of enhancing concentration, reducing anxiety, relieving stress, ADHD and even as a tool to keep sleepy drivers alert. I acknowledge the potential benefits and philosophy behind them; however, these devices are becoming wide-spread at CRA—I see them out in halls, classrooms, the cafeteria, and at recess. *I am not buying the spin!*

<u>I am placing a ban on spinners at our school</u>. This particular kind of toy has not been part of a "Toolkit" of devices currently available for students to use to relieve anxiety and get "fidgets out." Our teachers know that they have a number of sensory devices available to them to help children with special needs. We will continue to offer these tools to children who we recognize need them. All children at CRA are encouraged and permitted to stretch in class when needed, get up and get a drink of water, stand to complete an assignment, go to recess, and sharpen a pencil. Teachers use these strategies to channel most children's impulses. These toys are now ubiquitous at CRA and we ask for your help by letting your children know they need to stay at home.
