# Free and Reduced Meals at Canyon Rim Academy

#### 2023-2024

Children need healthy meals to learn. **Canyon Rim Academy** offers healthy meals every school day. **Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals.** Lunch costs **\$2.50** per day or reduced price is **\$0.40**. Breakfast costs **\$1.50** per day or reduced price is **\$0.30**. You may pay online through a link on the website, **www.canyonrimacademy.org** or send cash or check to the front office.

All students that received free or reduced meals last year will still receive those benefits for the first 30 days of the new school year or until a new application is received and processed.

Printed applications are available in the office at any time throughout the year. A downloadable form can be accessed through the website. You may also apply online by registering for Aspire, the student information system, and filling out the application online. The information provided by the household is confidential and will be used only for purposes of determining eligibility and verifying data. There is never an overt identification of children qualified for free or reduced lunch at any time.

Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Eligibility Income Guidelines. All school-aged children in income eligible households can receive school meal benefits regardless of the immigration status of household members, and information provided by the household will not be used for immigration-related purposes. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP, TANF or FDPIR are eligible for free meals. Also, foster children, or children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway or migrant qualify for free meals.
